Each year, South Africa marks the campaign of 16 days of Activism against the Abuse of Children and Women from 25th November to the 10th of December. This year campaign is addressing the theme: **Count Me in: Together moving a Non-Violent South Africa forward.**

The 16 days Campaign is important because we commemorate many milestones this year.

- It is the 16th year of the campaign,
- and will also reflect on 20 years of democracy in South Africa,
- and 60 years of the Women's Charter.
